SSCP Quality Assurance Framework and Learning and Improvement Framework

The SSCP have recently published their <u>Quality Assurance Framework (QAF)</u> and <u>Learning and</u> <u>Improvement Framework (LIF)</u>. The QAF demonstrates the approach to evaluating the effectiveness of safeguarding children arrangements in Solihull. It includes several components such as multi-agency and single agency audits, multi-agency datasets, independent scrutiny and the voice of children, young people, families & front-line practitioners. This sits alongside the LIF which demonstrates how learning is identified, disseminated, and implemented in practice within a multi-agency context, to improve outcomes for children and young people and their families within Solihull. The SSCP disseminates learning through a range of mechanisms such as the SSCP newsletter, embedding learning into our multi-agency training, webinars and learning events.

Learning from Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews in Solihull

In May, the SSCP hosted a webinar on teams to raise awareness of key learning from recent child safeguarding practice reviews and demonstrate what has been done in response to the recommendations. For those who were unable to attend, the webinar can be found <u>here</u>.

Learning from Multi-Agency Audits 2022/23

Throughout 22/23 the SSCP Audit Group completed 5 multi-agency audits, looking at the following themes: Domestic Abuse, Strategy Meetings, Physical Abuse, Partnership Engagement in Multi-Agency Meetings and Sexual Abuse. The findings from these audits, both individually and as a whole, as well as what we have done as a result of those findings can be found <u>here</u>. Our audit findings help us to identify what we want to do differently for our children and families in Solihull. One of the key findings across a number of our audits is reminding us to consider a Childs individual differences and their intersectionality, particularly when trying to understand their lived experiences. The NSPCC have produced learning for practitioners in relation to:

- <u>safeguarding d/Deaf and disabled children and young people</u>
- <u>safeguarding LGBTQ+ children</u>
- <u>safeguarding children who come from Black, Asian and minoritised ethnic communities</u>
- <u>safeguarding children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)</u>
- looked after children
- <u>child mental health</u>

Our Physical Abuse Audit also reminds us to ensure practitioners are being professionally curious. A quick guide on professional curiosity can be found on our Joint Learning from Domestic Homicide Reviews, Safeguarding Adult Reviews and Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews page on the SSCP website along with a range of other quick guides on topics such as risk assessments, information sharing and responding to allegations by family and friends.



NHS Birmingham and Solihull – Child Protection Medicals Multi-Agency Training

NHS Birmingham and Solihull have developed and delivered training on Child Protection Medicals for the multi-agency audience to assist in decision making when one may be required. These events were led by Designated Doctors for Safeguarding Children – Dr Helen Chaplin and Dr Jane Armstrong. They have also produced a recording for professionals which can be found <u>here</u>.

West Midlands Regional Procedures Updates

Over the last few months, a number of our regional safeguarding procedures have been reviewed such as <u>Children living away from home</u>, <u>Children from abroad</u>, <u>Children missing from care</u>, <u>home</u> <u>and education</u> and <u>Physical Abuse</u>. Some of our procedures have also had some amendments such as a new section of victim blaming language being added to our <u>Online safety</u> procedure.

Procedures are updated at various points throughout the year and our procedures site has an amendments page to ensure you don't miss anything. You can also sign up for updates on the website <u>here</u>.

Open Consultations

Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023

The government currently have an open consultation in which a number of changes are being proposed to Working Together, this includes Education becoming the fourth statutory partner in safeguarding partnerships. The link to the proposed changes and consultation can <u>here</u>.

Information sharing advice for safeguarding practitioners

This consultation seeks views on a revision to non-statutory guidance: Information sharing advice for practitioners providing safeguarding services to children, young people, parents, and carers. Domestic Homicide Review Legislation

The Safeguarding Practice Learning Forums are faciliatated by the SSCP and Solihull Safeguarding Adults Board (SSAB) and are a way of bringing practitioners and managers from a range of partner agencies together to share learning as well as providing a 2-way consultation process for the SSCP and SSAB to hear directly from frontline practitioners. The training is committed to sharing important learning and recommendations from DHR's with a view to inform and change guidance and practice amongst professional networks, including identifying earlier opportunities to intervene, to reduce the risk of harm to victims and their families, manage perpetrators harmful behaviour and share information about agencies and services that can assist.
