Solihull Safeguarding Children Partnership have developed an Early Help Strategy which outlines our approach to effective early help that can offer children and young people the support needed, when they need it, to reach their full potential. The strategy is essential to ensure that there is effective co-ordination of the identification, assessment and intervention of children and their families as they emerge to ensure that the needs do not escalate to the extent that statutory intervention is required.

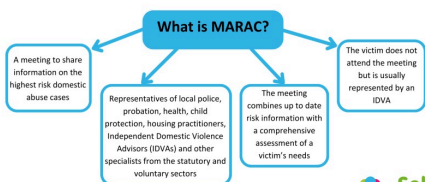
Who's in Charge?
