SSCP Training 2024-25

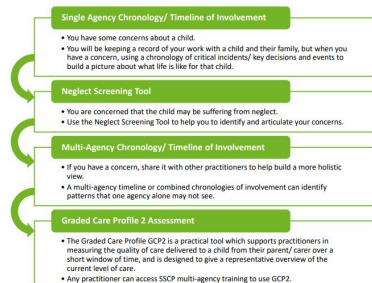
